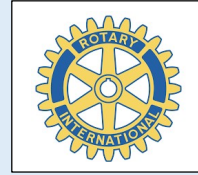

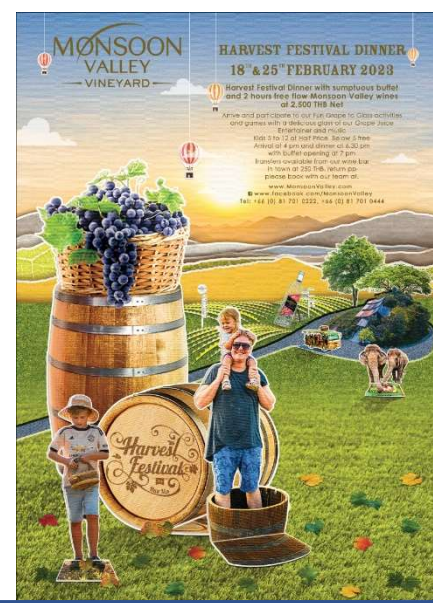

This week's presenter: Cell Dilon from the Junior Asian Golf Academy.

Cell presented an overview of the JAGA program.



- Affiliated with a Canadian High School accredited program which can be offered to students in Thailand.
- Program designed to help junior golfers become professionals, but at the same time providing a solid education foundation.
- Black Mountain is partnered in the program. The students will be housed, trained, and schooled at the Black Mountain facility.
- Estimated total cost per student per year is 1.5 million baht. First day of school is scheduled for September 4th.
- International exposure at the college level thus leading to potential student sport scholarships.

According to Cell, only 2% of the student golfers will go on to make money in the golfing industry, while 98% will not. With this program all the students will have an education to fall back on regardless of what their future careers turn out to be.

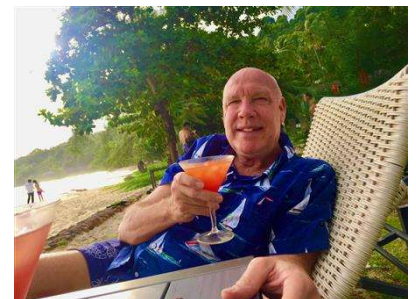
All three members entered teams, with Michel's team HindiSwiss coming in as runners up.
