Rtn Benjamas was asked to update members and guests on future Rotaract projects:

The Patrol Police Schools Project charity event is co-organised by Rotaract Club of Stamford International University, Hua Hin Market Village, Rotary Club of Royal Hua Hin, and Stamford International University.

The main thrust of the project is to help 11 patrol police schools in Prachuab Kirikhan, but will begin with the first two, Baan Tha Wang Hin and Baan Khao Jao School on May 11-12, 2019. Our Club will donate 195 school bag packs to both school students as it is the beginning of the semester (school term).

On Saturday May 11th the Rotaractors will go to Baan Tha Wang Hin Patrol Police School, and on Sunday May 12th they will visit Baan Khao Jao Patrol Police School. A number of activities are planned over the two days and these are available on the RCRHH website.

PE Napa informed Rtn Benjamas that these dates coincide with the District Training in Trang and 11 board members and Rotarians will not be available.

On Thursday 23rd May 2019, Stamford International University Rotaractors will be holding their International Charity Night 2019, which is co-organised by themselves, the Rotary Club of Royal Hua Hin, Hua Hin Market Village and Stamford International University.

The party will be held on at Hua Hin Market Village starting from 5:30pm with the purpose of raising funds for the Rotaract Club of SIU, enabling them to complete their University Social Responsibility activities. This year their charity project is to help support 11 Patrol Police Schools in Prachuabkirikhan, at the border of Thailand, with the first event already planned for 10th – 11th May 2019.

The main event for the evening will be the Bohemian Costume Contest, as well as some exciting shows on stage. There will also be food on sale at the many international stalls and beer, wine and soft drinks will be available for sale.

P Brian then introduced David Watson who would talk about the Royal Coast Review.

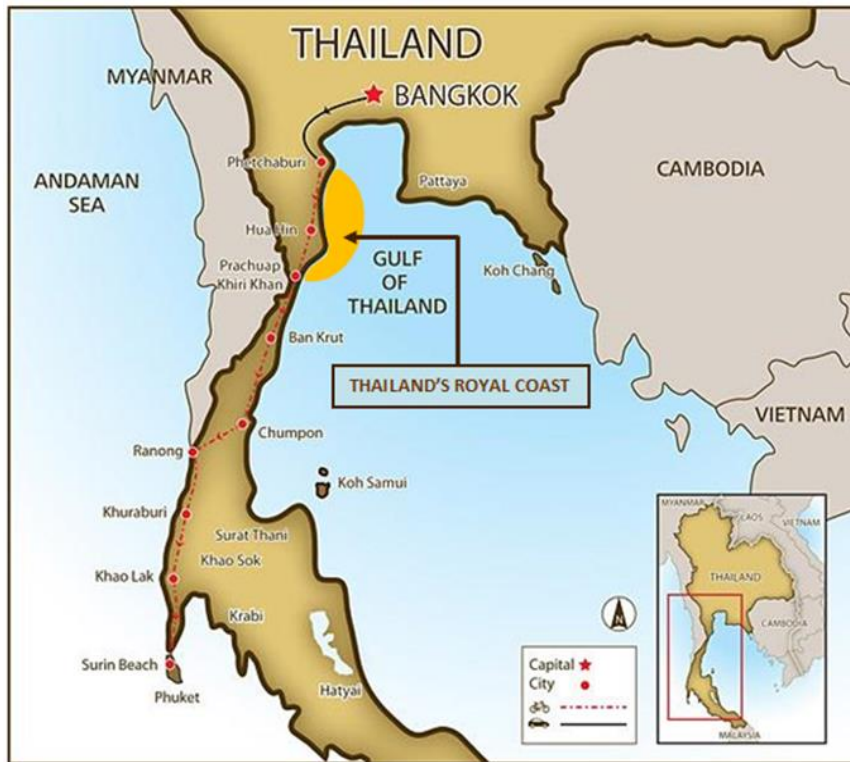
David introduced himself as a 10 pound Pom in that back in the 1960's British families were attracted to emigrate to Australia for 10 pounds to help fill the skills shortages that were apparent at that time in Australia.

David gave a potted history of himself of his life in Australia and his new life here in Thailand.

David informed the members and guests that after a while in Thailand he felt he needed to do something in Thailand and became the editor of Hua Hin today for 4 years ending in January 2019.

In January 2019 David started a face book web page called the 'Royal Coast Review' which was designed to clarify the Thai Riviera which has been promulgated since 2006, then 2013 and again in 2018 which was designed to promote tourism in both Petchaburi and Prachuab Khiri Khan.

With plans to build a 'Royal Coast' around Hua Hin, however there is some confusion regarding what is Hua Hin and Cha Am and the boundaries.
